The Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle was founded in 1969. It is dedicated to excellence in theatrical criticism and to the encouragement and improvement of theatre in Greater Los Angeles. Through the years, we've championed local artists and have been privileged to see world-class theatrical performances.

An Awards show is a fun and engaging opportunity to celebrate these artists. Over the years, the LADCC Awards has taken place in many locations and in many different forms. When the rise of Covid caused a halt to community gathering, we still awarded artists with plaques for excellence, but when you're recognizing theater – a visceral, communal experience – you want to give back in kind.

Early last Summer my LADCC colleague Patrick Chavis and I were tossing around the idea to produce a side-by-side broadcast of the in-person awards, similar to when I produced the 2015 First Annual Stage Raw Awards. But when the Board decided on an extended number of well-deserved nominations, we found ourselves over 100 seats short in our original space. So: More awards or an inperson show? The Black List is a platform dedicated to nurturing storytelling and empowering writers to maximize their professional potential.

First established in 2005 as an annual survey of Hollywood's most-liked unproduced screenplays, the Black List has since grown into a comprehensive resource for the film, TV, and theater industries, serving thousands of agents, managers, showrunners, producers, financiers, directors, actor, and theater industry professionals.

Since its inception in 2005, more than 500 scripts from the Annual Black List have been produced, grossing over \$28B in worldwide box offices. Films produced from Black List scripts have won four Best Picture Oscars and 12 Best Screenplay Oscars since 2007. In October 2012, the Black List launched a unique online community where screenwriters can make their work available to readers, buyers, and employers. Since its inception, it has hosted more than 100,000 scripts and provided more than 130,000 script evaluations. As a direct result of introductions made on the Black List, countless writers have found representation at major talent agencies and management companies and/or sold or optioned their screenplays. Several films have been produced from scripts showcased on the website, including NAACP nominated, MR MALCOLM'S LIST, Independent Spirit Awardnominated THE NOVICE, and Golden Globenominated NIGHTINGALE, starring David Oyelowo. The Black List also supports various programs for writersincluding mentorships, script development deals, production funds, play



commissions, and direct financial grants-in collaboration with corporate and industry sponsors. It distributed more than \$800K directly to writers in 2022 alone.
